## **GCSO LAW ENFORCEMENT SUMMARY**

DECEMBER 8, 2014 - DECEMBER 14, 2014

On Monday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, the Gulf County Sheriff's Office traveled to Okaloosa Correctional Institution in Crestview to execute an order to transport on Trevor P. Phillmon (24). Phillmon was due to appear in Circuit Court on Tuesday, December 9<sup>th</sup>. He was transported to the Gulf County Detention Facility (GCDF) and when he arrived was served with a warrant for Violation of Probation of his original charge of Possession of a Cellular Phone in Prison.

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, Sgt. J. Williams conducted a traffic stop in the 100 block of Jehu Road in Wewahitchka. A vehicle was observed traveling north on State Road (SR) 71 that displayed an expired tag which was not assigned to the vehicle. Contact was made with the driver, Richard L. Mullinax (62), from Wewahitchka. During the investigation it was determined Mullinax attached the tag that was not assigned to the vehicle and the vehicle was not registered. Mullinax was arrested and transported to the GCDF. He was charged with Attaching a Tag Not Assigned and No Vehicle Registration. He was released on a \$500 bond.

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, the GCSO received a complaint regarding a domestic disturbance in the 8200 block of US Highway 98 in St. Joe Beach. Deputy C. Harvey and Sgt. J. Williams responded to the call. At the conclusion of the investigation Sgt. Williams arrested Moses M. Johnson (34) of Tallahassee for Domestic Battery. Johnson was transported to the GCDF where he was later first appeared. He remains in custody on a \$1,000 bond.

On Tuesday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, the GCSO traveled to the Bay County Jail to execute two orders to transport on Isham J. Harris (42) and Susan L. Hughen (46). Both subjects were due to appear in Circuit Court. Upon his arrival at the GCDF Harris was served with a warrant for Violation of Community Control on his original charges of two counts of Burglary and Grand Theft. Hughen was transported back to the Bay County Jail at the conclusion of her court proceeding.

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, the GCSO extradited David A. Miller, Jr. (51) from the Bay County Jail back to Gulf County. The GCSO held an active warrant for Violation of Probation on Miller's original charge of Reckless Driving. He was booked into the GCDF where he was later first appeared and released on a \$250 bond.

On Wednesday, December 10<sup>th</sup>, the GCSO transported Trevor P. Phillmon (24) back to Okaloosa Correctional Institution in Crestview.

On December 10<sup>th</sup>, the GCSO received a complaint regarding the theft of two bicycles. Deputy D. Sanders responded to the call. The complainant reported the bikes were taken from his driveway in the 200 block of Court Street in St. Joe Beach. One bike is described as a tall men's mountain bike black in color. The bike has straight handle bars and neon green front forks and white pedal arms. The second bike is described as a Schwinn three wheeler with a black basket, tan handle bar grips and is green in color. The seat was said to be covered with black tape. The total estimated value of the bikes was \$375.

On December 10<sup>th,</sup> Deputy D. Sanders responded to the Express Lane located at 8820 W US Highway 98 in St. Joe Beach in reference to a counterfeit bill. The clerk reported that a suspected \$100 bill was passed at the store. Through further investigation it was determined to be a counterfeit note. The bill was a 1988 series. The GCSO continues to investigate the case.

On Thursday, December 11<sup>th</sup>, GCSO Investigators and Deputies executed multiple warrants for drug related charges. Each case was the result of investigations conducted by the GCSO Narcotics Unit.

At the time investigators arrested Stripling, Green, and Gates they were found in possession of meth and drug paraphernalia. At the time of Monks arrest she was found in possession of drug paraphernalia. Each defendant was transported to the Gulf County Detention Facility where they were later first appeared and issued a bond.

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, Deputy M. Garrett conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle just south of the White City Bridge on SR 71. The vehicle was clocked on radar at 80 mph in a posted 60 mph zone. The driver of the vehicle, Ralph L. Jamerson (25), was operating the vehicle on a suspended license. He was arrested for Driving While License Suspended/Revoked (DWLS/R) and transported to the GCDF where he was later conditionally released.
