Job Title:	Deputy Sheriff
Hours of Work:	Full-time, 12-hour shifts with rotating days off, some weekends and holidays. Subject to call for emergencies or to accommodate staffing requirements.
Rate of Pay/Benefits:	\$36,200/year; salary incentive for education and LEO experience pay

Job Duties:

Perform a wide range of general law enforcement duties in the prevention, detection and investigation of criminal acts; apprehend and arrest law violator; safeguard lives and property; and related work as required. Investigate all complaints which are assigned to him/her or are brought to his/her attention by any means, and take enforcement action in those cases which come under the jurisdiction of the Sheriff's Office. The most important and essential job function of the position is attitude which includes the following: interacting positively and cooperating with co-workers, responding politely to customers, working as a team member, functioning under intense time pressure and responding in a positive manner to supervision. Use best efforts to prevent the commission of crimes, suppress all forms of commercialized vice and detain and apprehend criminals.

Prior law enforcement experience is preferred.
